Continued focus on the importance of accountability in fostering personal growth and leadership within the brotherhood, reflecting Masonic principles of self-improvement and mutual support.



VI. NMD: Project Description

The Nashville Masonic District and Order of the Eastern Star are embarking on a historic project to capture, preserve, and celebrate our collective legacy. This initiative will ensure that the stories, sacrifices, and triumphs of our lodges and chapters are documented in both digital and hardcopy formats. By doing so, we safeguard our history for future generations while creating a tangible symbol of our unity, resilience, and contribution to the community.

The project will result in a commemorative District history book, published as a hardback edition, which will include:

- · Lodge and Chapter Histories: A dedicated section for each lodge and chapter, capturing origins, leadership, milestones, and impact.
- Picture Section: A collection of photographs showcasing events, members, community work, and memorable moments.
- · Miscellaneous Section: Special dedications, memorials, and other significant contributions that deserve recognition.

This book will serve as both a record and a source of inspiration, reconnecting us with the deep commitment of those who came before us and reinforcing our responsibility to carry the torch forward.

Additionally, the History Project will serve as a **secondary fundraiser**, with proceeds supporting district and chapter initiatives. To maintain relevance and ensure ongoing preservation, the project will be repeated every 5-10 years, creating a living record of our evolving history.

Project Timeline

Phase 1: Launch & Leadership (Sept 1 – Oct 1, 2025)

- Official project announcement across lodges and chapters
- Each lodge and chapter selects a History Committee Lead
- District Committee is formed with representatives from all lodges and chapters

Phase 2: Collection & Documentation (Oct 1, 2025 – Feb 1, 2026)

- o Committee leads begin gathering historical records, photos, and memorabilia
- Lodge/Chapter history write-ups prepared and reviewed
- OES and Masonic District stories compiled
- First progress check-in with District Committee (Dec 2025)

Phase 3: Compilation & Editing (Feb 1 – Apr 1, 2026)

- Final materials submitted by April 1, 2026 (absolute deadline)
- District Committee works with editors and designers to format book
- Proofs circulated for corrections and approvals
- Set Pricing

Phase 4: Publishing & Fundraising (Apr 1 – Jul 1, 2026)

- Book sent to publisher for hardback printing
- Fundraising campaign launched (pre-orders, sponsorships, commemorative copies)
- Promotional events to highlight the release of the book

Final Delivery

July 1, 2026 – Official release of the Nashville Masonic District & OES History Book (hardback editions)
